

IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES

CCA provides low-cost, quality legal immigration services to more than 6,000 clients annually. A multi-lingual nine person staff specializing in immigration law provides comprehensive immigration legal services to help eligible individuals and families obtain their permanent legal status, assist clients with the naturalization process, and provide legal representation during deportation proceedings. We specialize in assisting survivors of domestic violence, abandoned or neglected foreign children, detained clients, and victims of trafficking and crimes.

The Immigration Legal Services Program provides services for low income immigrants through appointments only. All new potential clients must obtain a consultation to assess their immigration options. Immigration Legal Services does not represent clients with domestic violence convictions, child abuse or child neglect convictions, or other such serious crimes.

Our Program provides the following services to eligible persons:

- **Family based applications.** Petitions for family members to reside legally in the United States based on the current categories of eligible family members.
- **Asylum based applications.** Services for immigrants seeking asylum before the immigration service and also before the Immigration court. Services for asylees seeking to petition for family members and services for refugees seeking to adjust their status.
- **Immigration court defense services.** Direct representation before the Atlanta Immigration Court.
- **Legal Orientation Services** with support of the Vera Institute of Justice for detainees and custodians of juveniles in immigration court proceedings.
- **Naturalization services** for eligible applicants.
- **Services under the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA).** Including obtaining legal status and work permits for the victims and also providing referrals for basic needs.
- **Legal immigration services** for Trafficking victims, victims of crimes (U visa).
- **Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) visas.** Obtaining juvenile court orders and obtaining lawful immigration status for children who have been abandoned, neglected, and abused and are in the U.S.
- Various other lawful status as derived from the Immigration law.
